Don Mills Regeneration Area Study Open House Meeting

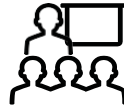
City Planning is undertaking a study to establish a new vision for the Don Mills Regeneration Area lands.

This work will build on the Don Mills Crossing Secondary Plan and identify what the future policies should be to guide redevelopment on the lands as they evolve from employment uses to new mixed-use communities. The study will focus on land use, parks and open space, phasing, streets, community services and facilities and built form, resulting in a City-initiated amendment to the Official Plan that is tailored to these lands.

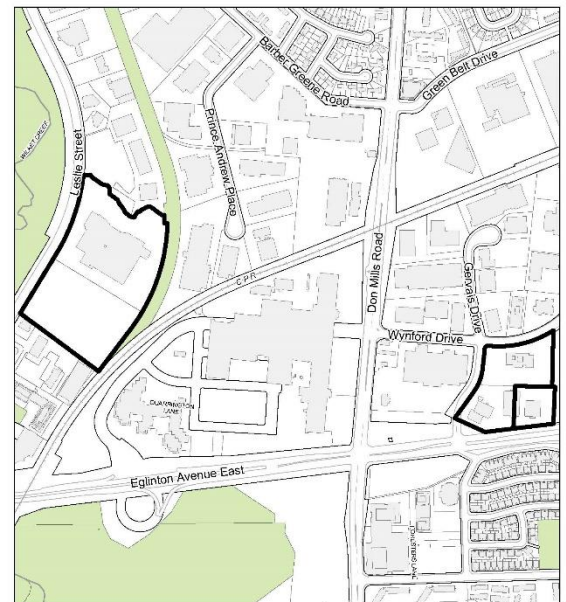
Join us to learn more:
